

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What ages and grades do you serve?

We accept students from three years of age through twelfth grade. Admission requirements vary depending on a student's age or grade level. Our school is divided into four departments: Preschool (K3 and K4), Elementary (kindergarten through fifth grade), Middle School (sixth through eighth grade), and High School (ninth through twelfth grade).

How often do students receive religious instruction?

The Bible is the focal point of our curriculum. Teaching the principles of God's Word permeates daily instruction in all subjects. All students attend chapel one day each week. The chapel program includes worship through music a lesson from God's Word.

Is financial aid available?

Assistance is available through the Eagle Scholarship Fund. Financial aid application forms are available in the school office or may be completed online. The deadline to apply for financial aid is April 15, 2010.

Is the school accredited?

Yes, our school is accredited by the Tennessee Association of Christian Schools (TACS) and is approved by the Tennessee State Department of Education (SDE).

Do students bring their lunch or can they buy it?

We have a full-service cafeteria. Students may either bring their lunches to school or buy a hot lunch. This option is available to students from the first grade through high school on a daily basis. Depending on the option selected, lunch is included in the tuition cost for children in preschool and kindergarten.

Are uniforms required for students?

Preschool and kindergarten students do not wear official school uniforms. Students in grades 1-12 must wear a uniform each day.

Does the school have an athletic program?

Fourth through twelfth grade students have a variety of athletic opportunities. Physical education begins in the third grade and continues through high school. We participate in interscholastic competition in volleyball, cross country, basketball, soccer, golf, and tennis.

What opportunities are available in the fine arts?

Music instruction begins in kindergarten and continues for all students through elementary school. Art instruction begins in fifth grade, and high school students may take elective courses in the visual arts. We are well known for our exceptional speech and drama programs for upper elementary and secondary students. Students annually participate in local, regional, and state fine arts competitions, and high school students regularly qualify for national fine arts competition.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

2010-2011 Academic Year

Preschool & Kindergarten

Registration Fee: \$235 per child

The registration fee covers the use of school textbooks, entrance tests, achievement tests, and subscriptions to Sycamore Education (a web-based communication service featuring access to homework assignments, students' grades, etc.).

Half-Day Tuition

Three-, Four-, and Five-Year Olds: \$3,100 (first child)
\$2,900 (second and third child)

Full-Day Tuition

Three-, Four-, and Five-Year Olds: \$4,900 (first child)
\$4,600 (second and third child)

The half-day program is from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM on scheduled school days. The full-day program includes class, full daycare and lunch. Full-time hours are 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday. This includes non-school days that are not holidays from August 11 through May 26.

Elementary & Secondary

Registration Fee: \$335 per child

Tuition

Elementary (Grades 1-6): \$4,450 (first child)
\$4,050 (second and third child)

Secondary (Grades 7-12): \$4,500 (first child)
\$4,100 (second and third child)

Tuition may be paid annually, semi-annually, or monthly. Monthly payments are based on a ten-month payment plan beginning in August and ending in May.

Before & After School Childcare

Before school care and after school care are available to Academy students at the rate of \$3.00 per hour per child. Before school care begins at 7:00 AM, and after school care closes at 6:00 PM.

Sports Fees

Students choosing to participate in interscholastic athletics will be subject to sports-specific fees. These fees must be paid before the beginning of each sport. Parents may choose to participate in special fundraising opportunities in lieu of paying sports fees.

1. Application for enrollment
2. Guardian/Administrator conference
3. Interview with the prospective student (secondary students only)
4. Tennessee immunization certificate with all required immunizations
5. Medical examination signed by the attending physician
6. Signed Parent Agreement Form
7. Entrance testing
8. Copy of birth certificate
9. Two completed reference forms (high school students only)
10. Verification of health insurance
